In either case, you must explain why you included them or left them out.

Write in complete sentences. For those questions that require slightly more detail, please limit your responses to no longer than a paragraph.

The Research Write-Up is <u>due by 11am the day of</u> your scheduled Student Grand Rounds presentation. Submit it to Jack Bullion, Instruction Librarian, at <u>jack.bullion@unthsc.edu</u>.

The Write-Up is part of the Information Seeking component of your Student Grand Rounds grade. It is worth 18 points.
